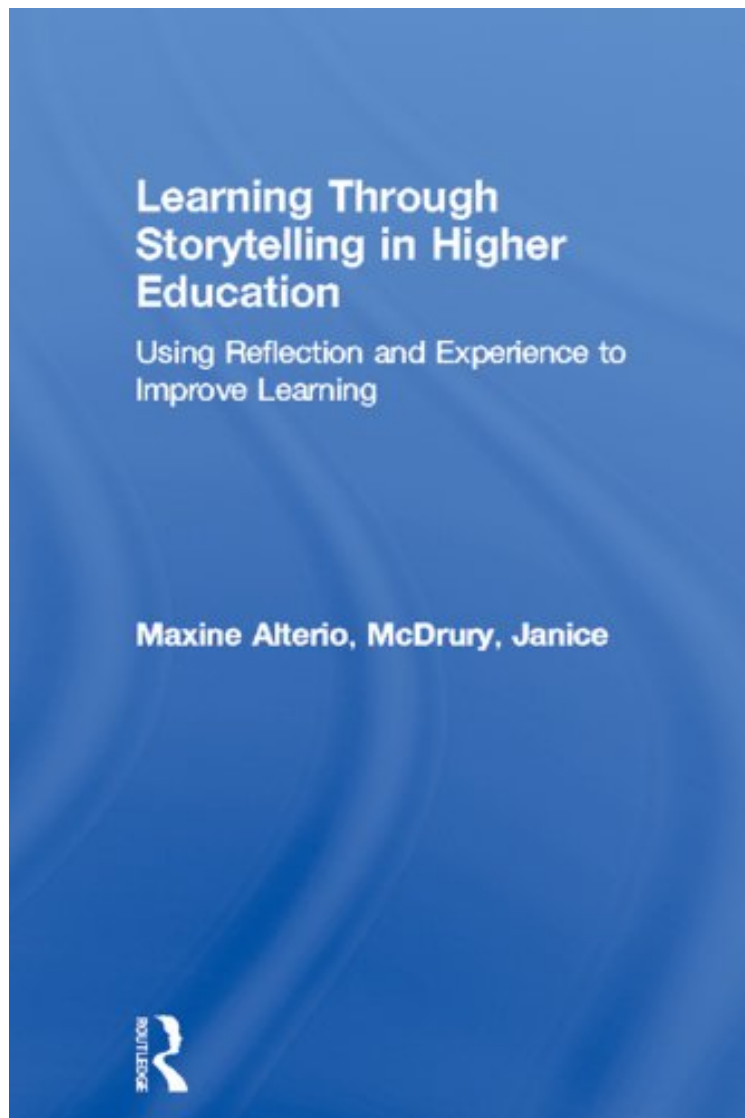

Learning Through Storytelling in Higher Education explores ways of using storytelling as a teaching and learning tool.
